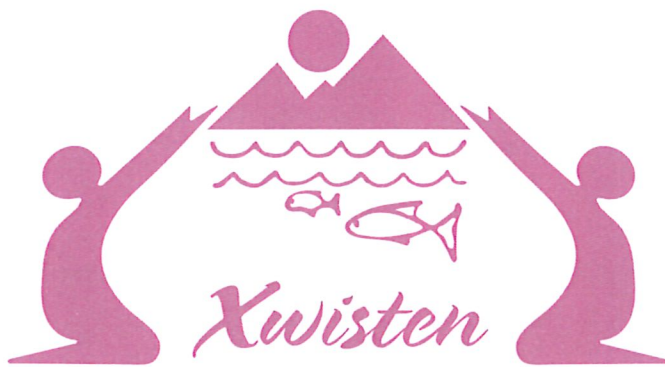

Re: Xwisten January Newsletter Housing Update

- **Reminder all Rent must be paid by 1st of every month**, talk to housing if conflict occurs.
- If you have rental arrears, please stop in and complete arrears payment plan form, if not, will move to possible eviction
- **All garbage should be bagged/double bagged if heavy and inserted in garbage can, no loose garbage will be picked up as per new Lillooet Landfill guidelines**
- All garbage and recycle bins must be placed near road away from house, out by 9am convenient for driver for garbage pickup, if placed by house, will miss pickup
- Members can request garbage trailer; it will only be booked for two (2) days due to demand. Items must be sorted. (I.E. steel pile, wood, etc...)
- Currently applying for funding for house renovations/needs assessment/new infrastructure/water upgrades
- Housing Energy Assessments are being done, outcome to apply for funding for repairs
- FireSmart interior/exterior of your home and encourage all houses to do cleaning, declutter and bring excess garbage to transfer station (ask family and friends for assistance). Utilize garbage trailer and transfer station
- Encourage households to change over light bulbs to LED bulbs to conserve energy and will look at Energy Workshop at a later date
- Do not overload washing machines or dryers as this can burn out machine. Clean lint traps as needed.
- Watch out for rodents. Clean all food spills and crumbs, store all food in plastic or jars, use dedicated traps in safe/no touch areas
- **We encourage all dogs to be on a leash or fenced yard** and clean up pet feces for health and safety reasons. Report any animals off leash, and attacks
- Reminder, as per rental agreement, only two (2) pets per household
- **Dogs are chasing vehicles and some are bothering other dogs within their fenced yard and injuring dogs, dog owners identified will be notified. Reminder as pet owners you are responsible for damages and keeping your dog in your yard**
- Ask Band Administration for assistance for spaying and neutering
- Be ready for power outages, have extra blankets on hand, candles, dry/canned goods, snacks, have your home/travel emergency kits updated and ready

Bridge River Indian Band is seeking a Culture and Language Coordinator to support community-driven language and cultural revitalization work under the First Peoples Cultural Council (FPCC) Roots Language Program. This role supports Elders, language instructors, and cultural workers, and helps keep language activities organized, respectful, and well supported. The Culture Language Coordinator works closely with the Social Development Manager and the Roots Language Consultant to ensure activities reflect community priorities and meet FPCC Roots reporting requirements.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Promotes and creates opportunities for language learners to connect with fluent speakers of St'at'imc language
- Supporting Elder Language Instructors and Cultural Workers
- Ensures the efficient, inclusive and effective development and delivery of language and culture activity and services to the community of Xwisten
- Apply for grants and proposals that pertain to Culture and language, including funding reports
- Plan and coordination of program meetings, events, and training workshops as required, including the preparation of meeting, training materials and assist with notes or follow-up as required
- Monitor projects to ensure within budget
- Arrange and maintain recording and archiving of Culture Language files
- Develop monthly calendars of planned events for newsletter
- Other duties as assigned by the Social Development and Administrator


Dear Xwisten Community Members

FUEL MANAGEMENT WORK UPDATE **– BRIDGE RIVER AREA**

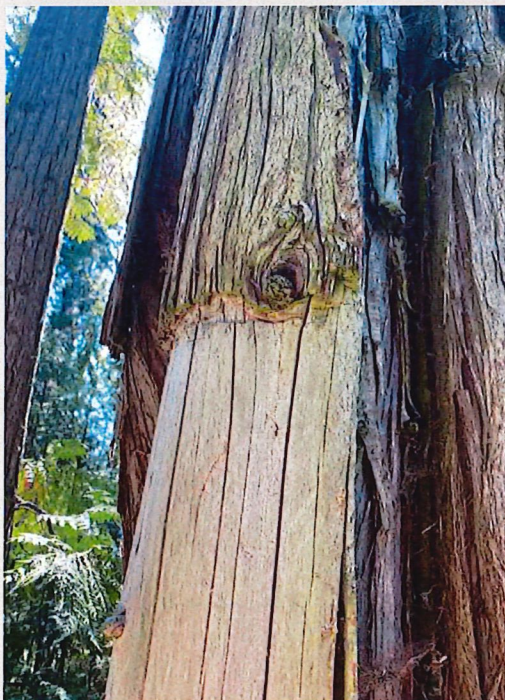
Fuel management work is underway in the Bridge River area as part of ongoing efforts to reduce wildfire risk and improve community safety.

Starting on January 6, 2026, the Bridge River Fuel Management Crew began work in Polygon 12HK. This work focuses on reducing overgrown and hazardous vegetation to help slow the spread of wildfire and improve access for fire crews in the event of an emergency.

Thanks to favorable weather conditions and strong teamwork, the crew has made steady progress and met all planned objectives to date. 3.37 Hectares have been completed so far, out of a total 11 hectares planned for this area.

Fuel management projects like this are an important part of FireSmart and wildfire preparedness efforts, helping to protect homes, infrastructure, and culturally significant lands. Work will continue as conditions allow, with safety remaining a top priority.

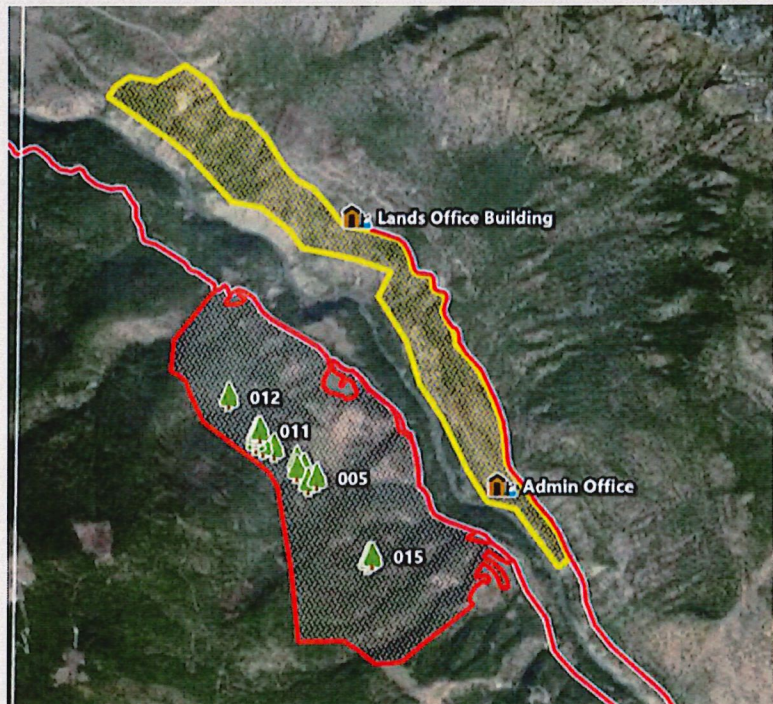
DOUGLAS-FIR BEETLE MANAGMENT

The Lands department has secured funding to tackle the Douglas-fir Beetle infestation that has established itself in and around the reserve. The goal is to reduce the beetle infestation and prevent a further spread through the landscape as well as reducing the wildfire risk presented by dead and dying trees.

The Lands department is currently conducting surveys on Ama and Moon Creek Road. Here the infestation is most severe. The identification of attacked trees will allow for efficient removal and thereby the protection of healthy trees.

Due to financial and operational restraints, we will not be able to remove all infested trees this year before the end of March. Areas that will not be subject to tree removal will be treated with so-called trap trees. These are healthy, large Douglas-fir trees that are felled near an active infestation and baited with pheromones. The beetles that emerge in April / May will be attracted to those trees. Thereby infestation can be restricted to a small area instead of spreading through the landscape. In fall, we will collect and destroy those trap trees and with them the maturing beetle larvae.

On and around the upper and lower reserve the severity of the infestation is much lower. The Lands Department will conduct



drone flights to locate red or fading Douglas-fir trees. If Douglas-fir beetle is recognized in those trees. Afterwards, either a ground survey will be conducted to identify all green trees in the surrounding with live beetle larvae and mark them for removal, or trap trees will be established.



Figure 1: Adult Douglas-fir beetles are dark brown and black and are 4.5 mm to 7 mm long.

A further method currently under review is the use of pheromones – either attractants or repellants – to protect sensitive areas such as private properties.

Our next newsletter will inform you about our treatment operations.

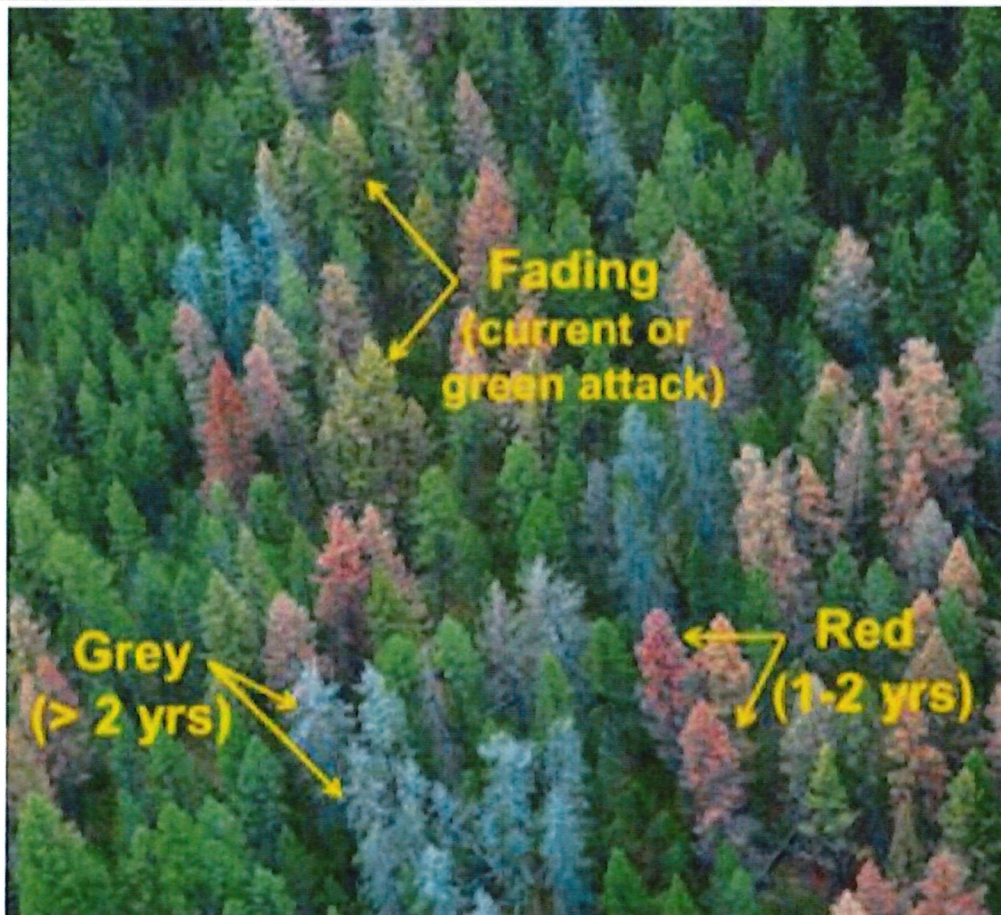


Figure 3: When Douglas-fir beetles attack, the needles of affected trees change colour in stages. A pale green or yellow colour indicates that the tree is currently under attack. A colour range from sorrel (red) to dark brown means that the attack is one to two years old and beetles could still be feeding on the tree. A grey colour means that the attack is older than two years and beetles are no longer attacking the tree.

XWISTEN FISHERIES DEPARTMENT UPDATE

Xwísten Fisheries is currently working on two restoration projects in the Lower Bridge River.

The first project in-reach 3 of the lower Bridge River and is located on what we call Grizzly Bar. This restoration project is on river right of the river and is an old mining site. It is a side channel that is submerged during spring and summer flows (late April to the end of August). During that time, when the side channel is wetted, it is a productive rearing area for salmonids and resident trout species. This is an important feature in the Bridge River, as the lower Bridge River is lacking rearing habitat (habitat for juvenile fish to grow) to support several salmonid species as well as resident fish species.

The prolonged Drawdown of the Downton Reservoir in 2022 caused damage to resident fish and fish habitat. As a result of this, the DFO ordered BC Hydro to work on offsetting measures in the lower Bridge River. This project was worked on by the Joint Planning Forum (JPF), which is a planning table for St'at'imc, DFO and BC Hydro. The JPF was able to choose Grizzly Bar as the location for the compensation of the Downton drawdown.

By working on Grizzly Bar, a year around connection of the side channel and the mainstream of the Bridge River can be achieved and fish will be able to



access the area year around for rearing. Secondly, the risk of stranding would be reduced once the dam is reducing flows to mimic reduced summer flows. During this time, Xwísten fish crews are very busy for a month to salvage fish that are at risk at stranding in Grizzly Bar (up to 1,000 fish were salvaged in 2025). Therefore, two improvements will be made to the Grizzly Bar restoration site: first fish stranding will be reduced or completely eliminated and second a permanently connection to the mainstem of the lower Bridge River will be created to increase the rearing habitat for juvenile salmonids and resident fish.

The second restoration project Xwísten fisheries department is currently working on is the restoration of the Horseshoe Bend for juvenile refuge area and adult spawning. This has been a long-standing project and will be a project for the next several years.

In the next newsletter, Xwísten Fisheries will provide a detailed update on the current design proposals for that area.

Please stay tuned for the monthly updates from Xwísten fisheries.

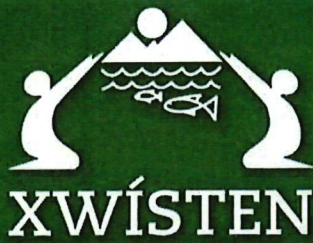


Notes:

BLOOD PRESSURE MEASUREMENT



**When you measure
your blood pressure:**

- ✓ Sitting position
- ✓ Back supported
- ✓ Arm bare and supported
- ✓ Use a cuff size appropriate for your arm
- ✓ Middle of the cuff at heart level
- ✓ Apply cuff according to manufacturer's instructions
- ✓ Do not talk or move before or during the measurement
- ✓ Legs uncrossed
- ✓ Feet flat on the floor



When should I take the readings?

- ✓ Before breakfast and 2 hours after dinner
- ✓ Before taking your medication
- ✓ After emptying bladder and bowel if needed
- ✓ After a 5 minute rest
- ✓ No tobacco, no caffeine in the hour before
- ✓ No exercise 30 minutes before

What device should I use?

- ✓ A validated blood pressure device
 - See Hypertension Canada's recommended devices at <https://hypertension.ca/public/recommended-devices>
 - Ask your pharmacist for an appropriate cuff size
 - It is important to use validated devices that meet the highest and current international standards (AAMI/ISO/ESH 2018). Devices that carry the logo below meet these standards. To see our list of validated devices, scan this QR code.

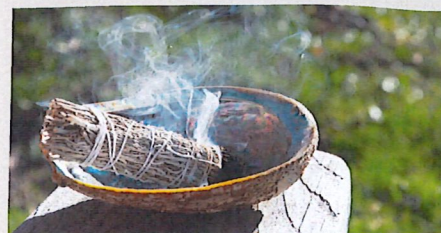
